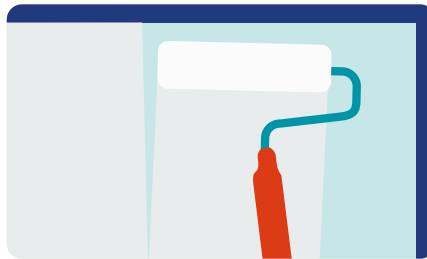


HANDY TIP

Step 1: Prep your space

Lay down drop sheets to protect your floors and furniture. Give your walls a good clean with sugar soap, then fill and sand any cracks or gaps. The smoother the surface, the better your final result.



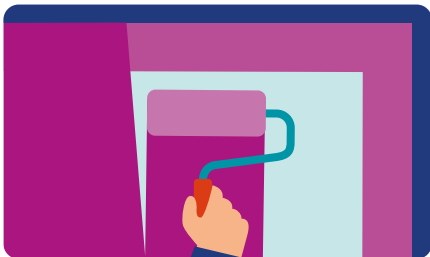
Step 2: Tape & prime

Use masking tape to protect trims, switches and edges to get clean, crisp lines. If your wall hasn't been painted before or has had repairs, apply a coat of British Paints® Prep 4in1™. It acts as a primer, sealer and undercoat all in one, giving you the perfect base to start painting.



Step 3: Cut in the edges

Now it is time to paint on your colour with British Paints® Clean & Protect™. Stir your paint well, then use a brush to cut in around ceilings, corners, switches and edges. This gives you neat borders and makes rolling paint on the main areas much easier.



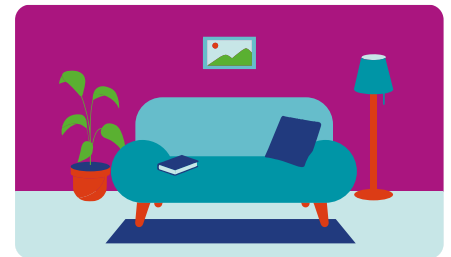
Step 4: Roll your first coat

Using a roller, work in sections. Paint in a zigzag or 'M' motion, then finish by rolling over the painted area with long, even strokes from top to bottom, overlapping each stroke to blend everything together. Take your time... steady, consistent rolling is the secret to a professional-looking finish. Let the first coat dry for 2 hours.



Step 5: Second coat time

Repeat the same process for the second coat, paying close attention to the finishing strokes to achieve full, rich coverage. Finally, remove any masking tape.



Step 6: Clean up & reveal

Wash your brushes and rollers, pick up the drop sheets and tidy your workspace. Step back and admire the transformation! You've created a fresh new space to enjoy for years to come. A simple project that makes a big difference.
