**HANDY TIP**  
Exterior walls can accumulate dirt and dust, so make sure you thoroughly clean and brush off any loose debris before you begin.



### Step 1: Clean & prep the surface

Give the wall a good scrub to remove dirt, flaking paint, mould or mildew. For brick, a high-pressure hose can help. Fill any cracks, sand rough spots and ensure everything is completely dry before you begin painting.



### Step 2: Protect & prime

Mask to protect trims, window frames and downpipes, and then protect your garden bed or floor with a drop sheet. If painting over a bare surface, then start with British Paints® Prep 4in1™ primer. Cut in along edges followed by rolling to cover larger areas. Skip the primer if your surface is previously painted.



### Step 3: Roll or brush the first coat

Now it is time to apply your colour with British Paints® 4 Seasons®. Cut in along edges and trims, then work in vertical sections painting from top to bottom. For weatherboards, brush into the overlaps; for brick, use a roller with a pole. Let the first coat dry for 2 hours.



### Step 4: Apply the second coat

Allow the first coat to dry, then repeat the process to build strong, even colour. This second layer is key to long-lasting protection from the elements. If your surface has never been painted – start with a primer, or do three coats.



### Step 5: All about the finish

As you come to the end of each section, make sure to finish with long, even rolls or strokes. Use the same roller or brush without re-loading the paint to blend areas together with seamless coverage.



### Step 6: Clean up & love the look

Remove the masking, tidy up the drop sheets, and clean your tools. Then step back and admire the transformation – your refreshed exterior is ready to shine!
